When the pandemic hit, President

Trump and Congress designated food chain workers from field to table as "essential workers" because despite legal status they ensure people eat. Thus, the ICE raids on farms, factories and restaurants are unjustifiable. The June 1 San Diego raids and community reaction, followed five days later in Los Angeles, sparked a question in me: what can I do to ensure our food chain workers are afforded due process and not lost to the



American food system? But there was welcome news. The agriculture industry moved President Trump to announce a halt to the raids on farms, restaurants, and processing plants last week. Then I really felt a surge of hope when five million Americans in 2100 communities came out to protect the rule of law on June 14th. But on June 16th, the President reversed course and called for raids again on food chain workers. Answers to my question have come clear: refuse denial, face the discomfort, and show up in several ways. **READ MORE**

ROC Joins Legislative Meetings in Support of AB 411

Last week, Roots of Change joined the California Cattlemen's Association and other co-sponsors of AB 411 (Papan) in meetings with legislative offices in the California Senate ahead of the bill's upcoming hearing before the Senate Agriculture Committee. This follows the bill's unanimous passage on the Assembly floor with a 79-0 vote. AB 411 is also scheduled for a hearing in the Senate Environmental Quality Committee. AB 411 is a critical step forward in lowering costs for California ranchers while advancing the state's climate goals and furthering ROC's mission to scale regenerative agricultural practices. Whether it's a shepherd using animals to reduce fire risk, a large-scale strawberry operation, a mid-sized organic farm, or a dedicated land steward, they all share a common commitment: caring for the soil, supporting their workers, and continually improving the way we grow our food. We heard the passion of farmers who work the land to feed the nation and a desire to be trusted by the people. We heard a clear desire to overcome the polarization and a willingness to engage those who may have different perspectives. We will have additional conversations across the state this year. Mapping Resilient Food System Infrastructure Project

Over the last 6 weeks, the ROC team has been traveling throughout California for CDFA and its Resilient Food Systems Infrastructure (RFSI) Project.





This project is focused on mapping the middle of the food supply chain infrastructure that small and mid-size farmers use across the state. The team is identifying existing, planned, and needed infrastructure, such as cold storage, commercial kitchens, freeze drying facilities, and mills, to name a few examples. This project will identify where future funding for the food system infrastructure should be directed. Our new focus is on creating a resilience hub and cooling center in the farmworker community of Terra Bella using a \$2.5 million grant from the **Governor's Office of Land Use and Climate Innovation**. Our team will be

adding equipment, and educational programing for a new middle school multi-use gym, distributing resilience kits in four Great Valley counties, and working with growers to develop innovative strategies to prevent heat illness, while maintaining high productivity. We are deeply motivated to lower the stress of farmworker families feeling terrorized by ICE raids. We will keep you updated on progress.
