We believe common concerns for workers, the food supply, and the power of food to unite can help foster the cohesion we need for our nation. Policy Update

Progress in Sacramento, Challenges



in Washington

Roots of Change continues to make policy strides in California, even as federal developments threaten progress to build a healthy and resilient food system.

California Legislative Advances – ROC to Testify in Support of AB 411

Today - Wednesday, July 16 - ROC will join Assemblymember Papin to testify in support of **AB 411** – known as the *Caring About The Terrain, Livestock, and Ecosystems* (C.A.T.T.L.E.) Act – when the legislation is heard before the Senate Environmental Quality Committee. This hearing follows the bill's unanimous (5–0) passage through the Senate Agriculture Committee on July 1. AB 411 would

allow farmers and ranchers to compost livestock mortalities using methods that improve soil health, reduce greenhouse gas emissions, and support regenerative agriculture in California.

ROC has also signed on in support of <u>SB 444</u>, authored by Senate Agriculture Committee Chair **Senator Melissa Hurtado**. The bill would update California's Welfare and Institutions Code to clearly affirm that **every Californian has the right to access sufficient, affordable, and healthy food** that is locally grown and raised—aligning with ROC's long-standing values and vision for a resilient and equitable food system.

State Budget Maintains Nutrition Commitments

Despite a tough budget year and sharp reductions in federal funding, Governor Newsom signed the 2025–26 California State Budget, which reflects a continued commitment to fighting hunger and advancing food equity. Among other priorities that support nutrition access for vulnerable communities, key investments include a one-time \$60 million allocation for CalFood to support the purchase of California-grown and produced food by California food banks, maintaining School Meals for All with an additional \$90.7 million, and \$36 million to restart the CalFresh Fruit & Vegetable EBT Program.

Federal Setbacks for Nutrition and Health

In stark contrast to the progress in California, President Trump signed <u>HR 1</u> into law on **July 4**, slashing funding for key federal nutrition and healthcare programs – including the complete elimination of funding for SNAP-nutrition education – and investments to address the climate crisis. These cuts pose a serious threat to millions of low-income families, including those relying on SNAP and Medicaid.

ROC will continue to track and respond to these developments and work with our partners across the state and nation to defend a just, resilient food system.
