We completed the COVIDrelief nutrition program. Along with our allies <u>Wholesome Wave, Public</u> <u>Health Institute, Center for</u> <u>Wellness & Nutrition</u> and the <u>Tangelo app</u>, we are thrilled that **100,000 people received nearly \$22 million in food benefits.** Our keys to success were 19 front-line organizations that enrolled over 29,000



families in only 8 weeks for which they received \$1.8 million in funding. In June look for our podcast with some of the key leaders and the final report documenting our success. Stay tuned, more to come from our partnership with Wholesome Wave.

Niche Meat Processing White Paper



In response to the pandemic and climate disasters impacting the meat supply chain, we have worked with the <u>UC Davis Food</u> <u>Systems Lab</u> and a ROC-<u>CCOF</u> coalition, to analyze challenges and opportunities and to offer recommendations. Our goal is to generate more wealth for rural communities by leveling the playing field for small and midsized producers. Our research included

interviews with 30 individuals involved in the high value meat sector. In June, we will deliver the report to policy makers, the coalition and make it available to

Ventura County Achieving Resilient Communities

We are into supporting farmworker community resilience. Our team includes, PHI's <u>Tracking</u> <u>California, Public Health</u> <u>Alliance of Southern</u> <u>California, CAUSE, Lideres</u> <u>Campesinas</u> and <u>MICOP</u>. Our engagement with farmworkers and other stakeholders has spawned a resilience campaign called *Cool Communities*. We seek to increase shaded and cool spaces in



farmworker neighborhoods and effective heat and smoke protections at work. We share our own current funding and have successfully won more grants for our front-line partners. This month we begin a dialogue with farmers and farmworker advocates in the hope they will join hands to strengthen the campaign. More on this later this summer.

Policy Advocacy Priorities

AB 125 The Equitable Economic Recovery, Healthy Food Access, Climate Resilient Farms and Worker Protection Bond Act -With bipartisan support, our coalition of 17 sponsors, backed by 143 supporting organizations, has advanced this groundbreaking \$3.3

billion bond proposal through the Assembly Ag Committee.

Healthy Stores Refrigeration Grant Program - Working with California Assembly Budget Committee Chairman, Phil Ting, our strongest champion for many years, we are seeking \$15 million to provide grants for refrigeration units that will be placed in corner stores across the state. The Governor is requesting \$20 million.

California Nutrition Incentive Program (CNIP) - Back in 2016, with Assemblymember Phil Ting, ROC spawned creation of the matching grant program managed by the <u>Office of Farm to Fork</u> at CDFA. We join Ecology Center in supporting Mr. Ting's request for another \$20 million to continue this highly successful program. The Governor is offering only \$15 million. We need your help.

Health Equity Fund - We are part of a Public Health Institute led coalition to create a health equity fund pilot program that would invest \$180 million in several communities to reveal how to prevent disease and lower health care expenditure for the state. Nutrition incentives, school food and other nutrition access initiatives guided by communities are part of the ask.
