California's Budget Cuts Will Be Especially Painful for Some

Roots of Change is deeply concerned over Governor Newsom's proposed cuts to small farm and food justice programs and regional food system infrastructure due to the economic downturn and resulting reduction in the California General Fund. The most worrisome cuts include the Healthy Refrigeration, Urban Agriculture, Farm to Community Food Hubs, Beginning Farmer and Farmworker Training grant programs. All of these aid communities and producers that have been historically underserved. And at the same time, given the magnitude of the revenue crash, we appreciate the careful approach taken by the Newsom Administration and key departments in many areas. Although lamentable, we do appreciate that only one aforementioned program, Farm to Community Food Hubs, was completely zeroed out. Actions to address the climate crises, the largest threat to public health we will face in this century, remain funded at levels unprecedented for a state. By any measure California continues to lead. We are committed to monitoring the cuts impacting efforts to build an equitable and resilient food system and to defend against further cuts if the state's revenue situation worsens. We are also working with allies to establish more funding whether or not the economic situation improves. We believe the public health and economic security of the state depend upon a just and resilient food and agriculture system that fairly invests in every scale of food producer and provides healthy food access for every family regardless of income level. We will continue to deliver that message to our friends in large-scale agriculture, local policymakers, Governor Newsom, the Legislature and our federal government.
